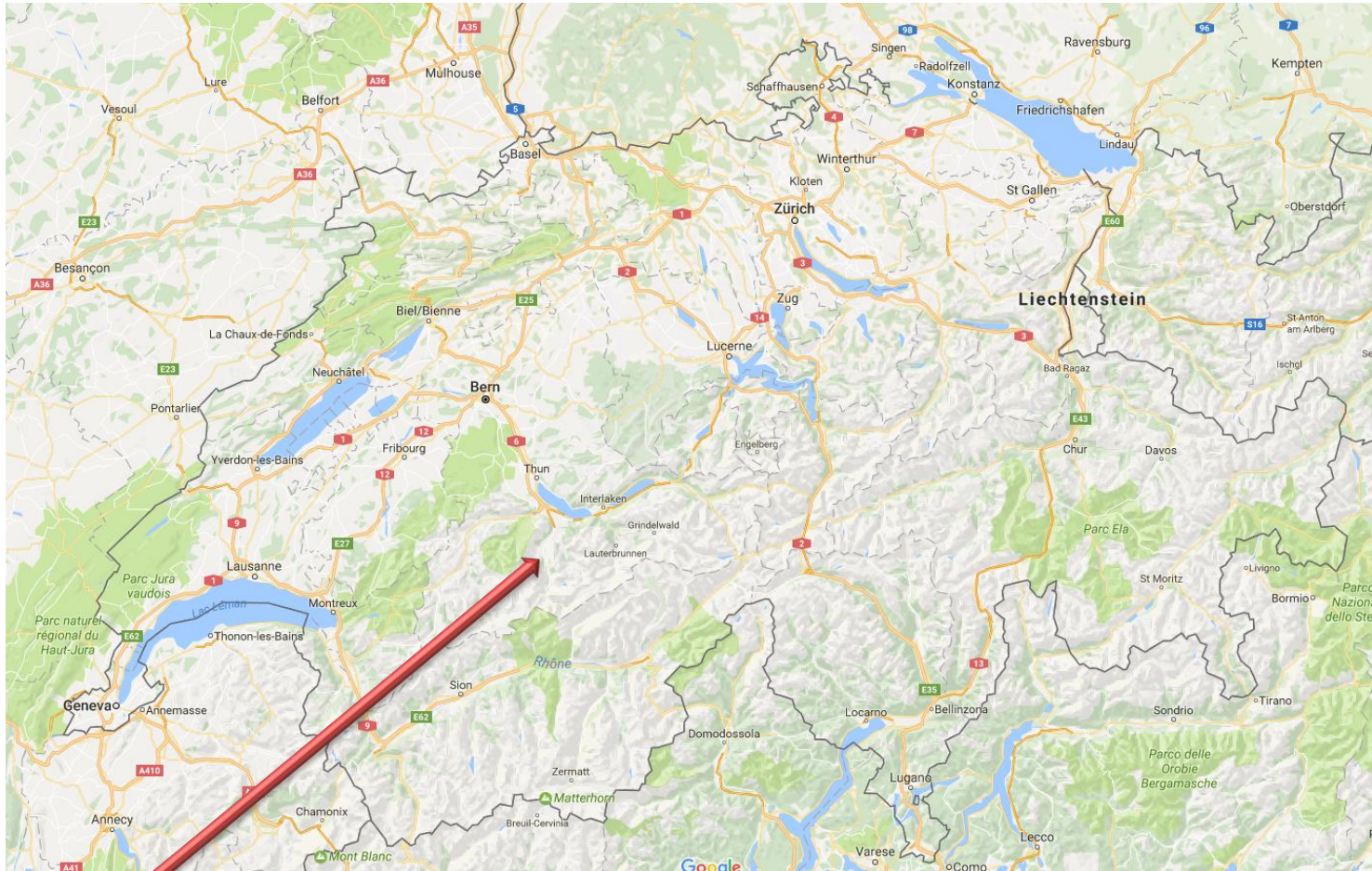

Why are we going to KISC?

- Kandersteg International Scout Centre is the World Scout Centre of the World Organisation of the Scout Movement. **It is your Centre!**
- Over 12,000 Scouts and Guides visit per year from more than 40 different countries. KISC is run by volunteer Scouts and Guides for all over the world.

How come?

- Following the success of the first ever Jamboree held in London during 1920 Lord Baden-Powell expressed his wish of a Permanent Mini-Jamboree where Scouts from all over the world could meet.
This was his dream.
- BP's dream came true and now **YOU** have the opportunity to visit Kandersteg International Scout Centre and **live YOUR Dream!**

Who's Going?

- Leaders
 - Leader in Charge – Andy Parker
 - Remaining leaders will be selected from the District Team and Section Leaders.
 - Selection based on numbers of YP going; experience and required skills.

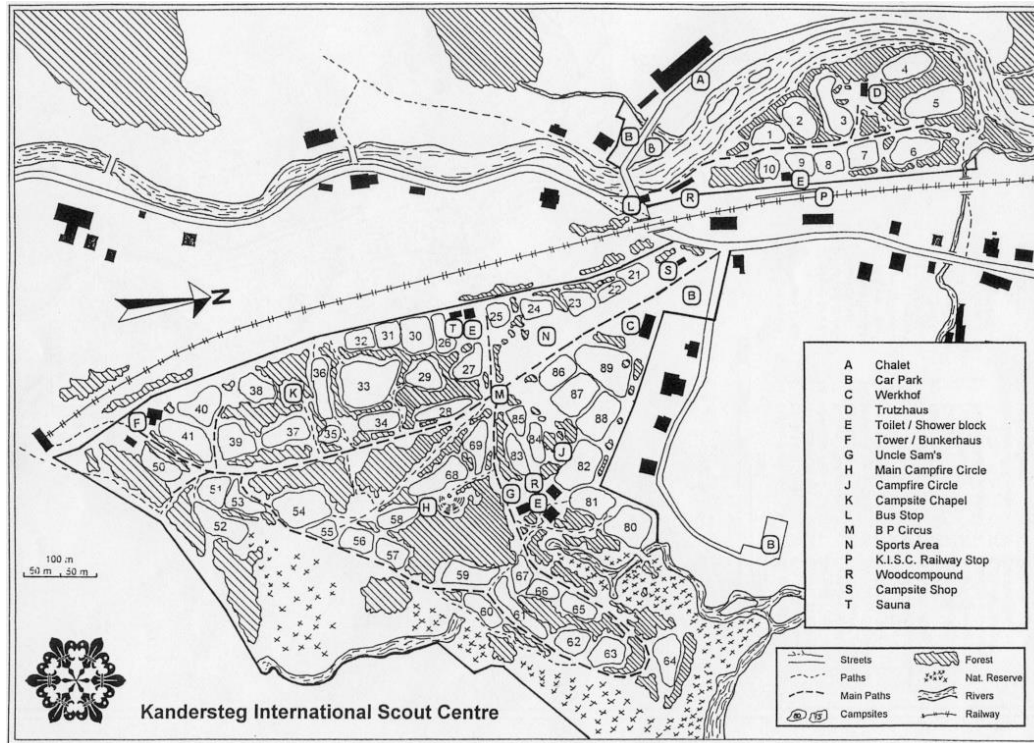
- Young People
 - From around the District. Groups or individuals.
 - You can go even if your leader isn't going.
 - Aged 12 – 17 at time of the camp.

Travel

- The main party will be travelling to KISC by luxury coach. Takes approx. 19hrs.
- There will be a central departure/arrival location in District area (to be notified later).
- Parents will be asked to drop and collect campers from the central location. Timings to be notified later.
- Dates: Outbound: Fri 27 Jul
 Inbound: Sun 05 Aug
- Baggage: 1 x average sized soft bags only (wheeled if possible)
 1 x small day sack
 Must be able to carry/drag themselves.
- Wearing... Uniform!
- Passports: Individual and valid for + 6 months after return date

Accommodation

- KISC.
- Camping – in tents, using our own equipment.
- On one of the many campsites.



Equipment

- All kit will be transported in either a van and/or trailer with the coach.
- Therefore, need to be kept to a minimum and as light as possible.
- Little room for luxuries!
- Central drop off point for camping kit prior to the camp and a suitable date for collection post camp.
- We will hire benches, tables and gas locally.

Catering

- Full Board. All meals are prepared by the resident catering team. They provide a nutritious balanced diet which is carefully planned to restore energy used during the day's activities.
- Breakfast and evening meals are taken on site and packed lunches are provided daily - so don't forget to bring lunch boxes and water bottles!
- **Let us know of any dietary needs, allergies etc**

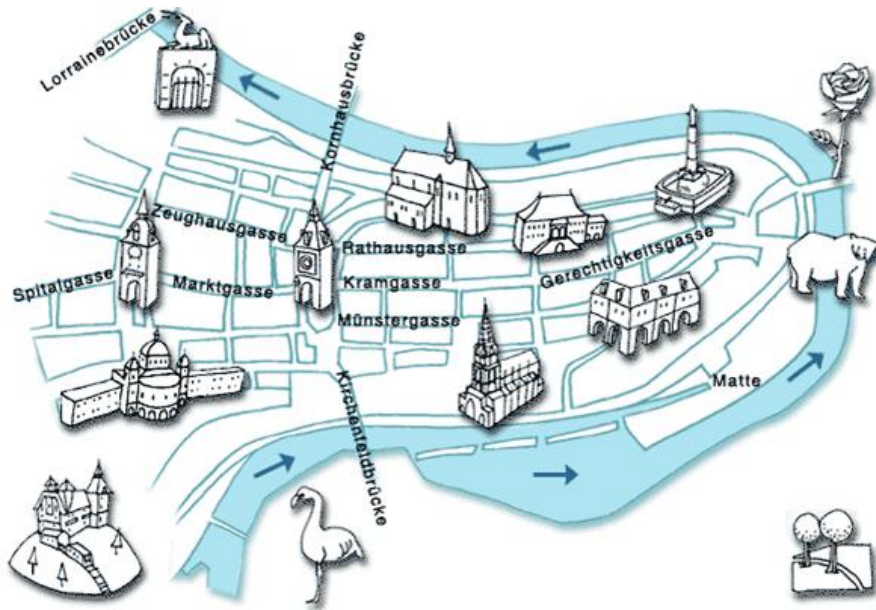


Activities

- Activities will depend in the main on numbers going, but also on the cost and age restrictions.
- Mix of day visits and adventurous activities.
- Activities may be guided or unguided.
- All activities undertaken will be governed by Scout Association rules.
- YP will choose the activities they would most like to do, but can't promise everything!
- Activity choices will be sent out after numbers are known.

Activities – Bern

- Explore the capital city of Switzerland. The Scouts will have a chance to visit attractions such as the parliament, the famous clock tower, Einstein's home, the famous bears, the Art museum and the shopping arcades.



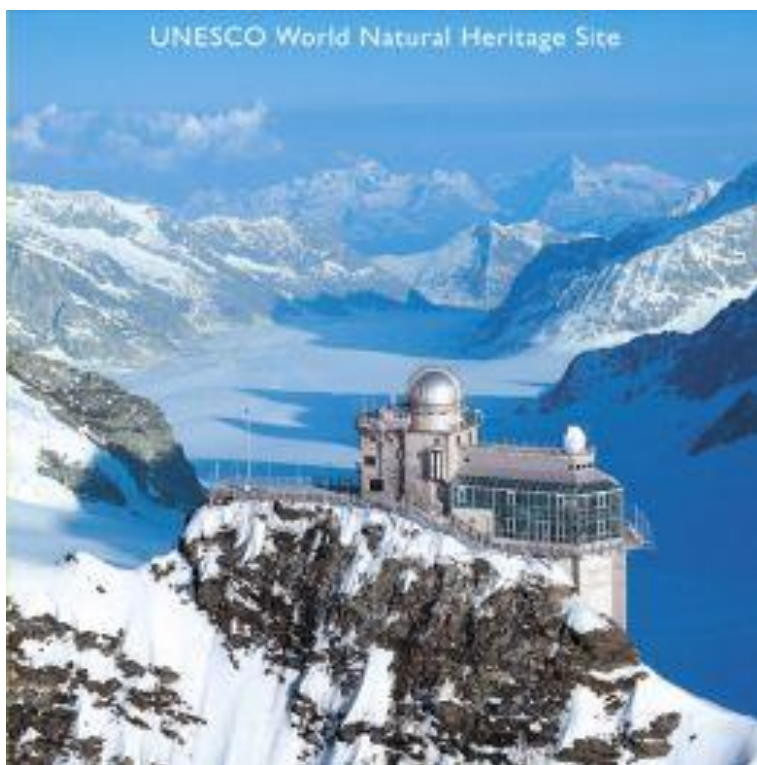
Activities – Oeschinensee



You will walk up to Oeschinensee in small groups using the electrifying environmental guide (learn all about the connection between glaciers and hydro power) and have a session on the summer sledge run (over 700m long!). A restaurant and shop will be open at the lake and a swim in the lake.



Activities – Jungfrauoch



- Take the train to Lauterbrunnen from where you embark on your trip up to [Jungfrauoch](#), the highest train station in Europe with some of the most spectacular views in the Berner Oberland, ice caves and dog sleds! Upon your return, leave the train at Kleine Scheidegg and hike down the renowned 'Eiger Trail' (Bergweg) - through the shadow of the North Face of this spectacular mountain. For those less adventurous there is a great Wanderweg too - but it is a 3.5 hour hike so be prepared. Train back.
- There will be an additional cost of approx £100 for this to cover the cost of train fares.

Activities – Chocolate & Cheese



- Travel over the Jaunpass to the Cailler chocolate factory in Broc. Enjoy the chocolate factory tour which is guaranteed to warm the taste buds of the biggest “chocoholics!”
- From Broc you will travel to the famous cheese capital of Switzerland, Gruyeres. Gruyeres, the former capital of the medieval earldom, is perched at 800 metres and is surrounded by watchtowers and ramparts. Enjoy some of Switzerland’s finest delicacies in these beautiful locations.

Activities – Brigerbad



- Huge thermal water centre.
- The perfect place to relax and enjoy spectacular mountain views. These are the biggest open air pools in the Alps with plenty of fun: a 182m slide, hot indoor and outdoor pools, an olympic length pool, lazy river and more.
- For an extra cost, adults can enter the Spa, relax in saunas, steam rooms and the thermal cave.
- Hike there or go on the train.



Activities – Hikes



- Kandersteg is a wonderful area to go hiking in and there are routes for everyone of all ages and of all abilities.
- The Centre offers guided and non-guided hikes, the Swiss footpath system is easy to use and well kept.

Swiss National Day



- Every year on the 1st of August, people across Switzerland celebrate the country's National Day. Also on the same day, in the year 1907, several boys came together with Robert Baden-Powell to begin the world's first scout camp on Brownsea Island in England.
- Here at KISC, we celebrate both of these events on August 1st! Our guests and staff from around the world come together for a really special day, full of international fun, friendship and adventure!
 - We will begin the day with everyone joining together for breakfast on the campsite;
 - Drop-in activities that will be on offer around the Scout Centre and the Village.
 - Carnival.
 - The day will culminate with a Scout parade through the streets of Kandersteg after a short ceremony in front of the historic Chalet.

- Baggage:
 - 1 x average sized soft bags only (wheeled if possible)
 - 1 x small day sack
 - Must be able to carry/drag themselves.

Insurance

- Scout Association – underwritten by Lloyds.
- Benefits Table:
 - Personal injury - up to **£5,000**
 - Medical and emergency repatriation expenses - up to **£10,000,000**
 - Hospital Stay Benefit - up to **£400**
 - Supplementary travel and accommodation expenses - up to **£15,000**
 - Personal Belongings - up to **£1,000** (limit **£250** for valuables/**£250** any one article, pair or set)
 - Money - up to **£1,000** for Scout party leaders, **£200** for other insured persons aged 16 or over and **£150** if aged 15 or under.
 - Credit card misuse - up to **£1,000**
 - Delayed Baggage - up to **£100**
 - Loss of passport - up to **£1000**
 - Disruption (cancellation or curtailment) – up to **£1000** for any one journey (maximum **£75,000** for all insured persons any one journey)
 - Missed departure - up to **£500**
 - Personal liability - up to **£2,000,000**
 - Legal Expenses - up to **£25,000**
 - Travel delay - up to **£60**

Health & Medical

- Health Forms
 - Issued for completion nearer the time
- EHIC
- Medicines
 - Usual scouting requirements
- KISC also provide a first aid station and contact to local medical facilities if required.
